Course Objectives:

Participants will:

- Acquire knowledge and resources to teach financial education
- Become aware of community resources to assist in teaching
- Network with other educators and community professionals
- Increase personal financial literacy

Course Requirements:

- Participate in ENTIRE conference including Staff Development/Graduate Credit Workshop on Friday, July 23, 2010.
- Develop lesson plan, teaching resources and evaluation/assessment materials for integrating curriculum and information presented at the conference into your classrooms.
- Identify what concepts/skills will be addressed/taught from the Iowa Core Curriculum – 21st Century Skills- Financial Literacy.
- Implement the lesson plan in the classroom and reflect on the experience. Please note the course will not end until December 1st and grades will be posted after this date.
- Make this a practical application for your classroom. Creativity and conciseness are encouraged, 3-4 well-written pages are sufficient. Supplemental examples of hand-outs, worksheets or activities are welcome.

Credit Available and Cost:

- 1 Graduate Credit, Drake University (\$130)
- 1 Graduate Credit, Morningside College (\$130)
- 1 Graduate Credit, Viterbo (\$130)
- 1 Licensure Renewal Credit (\$65)

Note: You can earn a credit in 2010 even if you earned a credit at a past conference. The cost for the credit must be paid in addition to the \$50.00 registration fee for attending the conference.

Tuition Reimbursement:

If you indicated on your Jump\$Tart Conference registration that you were interested in tuition reimbursement, a representative from the Iowa Jump\$Tart Coalition will work with you to locate a financial institution interested in providing a scholarship to reimburse you for the credit cost. Scholarships are distributed upon successful completion of the course requirements.

Register for the Credit On-line:

You MUST register on-line for the graduate or licensure renewal credit. This is a separate/different registration from the Jump\$tart Conference. You must pay at the time you register with a MasterCard or VISA credit or debit card. You must register by midnight on July 22th. PLEASE DO THE ON-LINE CREDIT REGISTRATION BEFORE YOU COME TO THE CONFERENCE!

Registration is on the AEA 267 website. If you have not signed up for a course in the past you'll need to create a login and password.

1. Go to www.aea267.k12.ia.us
2. Click on Professional Development, then AEA 267 Course Offerings (left side tabs)
3. Log-in with your username and password or create a new one.
4. The Home tab should be open
5. Go down to Course Search and in the box - Course # - enter 4399, Click Find Courses.
6. Choose View Sections.
7. Click on any of the words that are in blue type.
8. Under Sections – Choose Register
9. Read Disclaimer – Choose Accept
10. Choose Credit Type – Morningside, Drake, Viterbo, or Licensure Renewal
11. Under payment - Choose Pay Now or Pay Later
12. Enter your billing information.
13. Choose Submit Payment.
14. Print off a copy for your records.

Grading & Assessment Rubric:

Assignment will be worth a maximum of 16 points.
